Dues Are Due!

Our total dues will be \$97 (National \$72; State \$15; and local \$10). This is the final year of the national 3-year dues increases. Life members pay \$25 (\$15 State and \$10 local), and 50-year honorary life members do not owe dues. Grad students owe \$21.81 (\$18.81 national plus \$3 state). If the University is a member of AAUW, students owe no dues.

You will receive three notices from National about dues payment; as always, you may **pay by check or** by following the directions to **pay online via credit card**. If you pay online, National reimburses the State and Branch dues. If members want **to donate additional funds** toward our branch scholarships, etc., paying by check is the method to use.

To pay by check: Please make the \$97 check payable to "AAUW Penobscot Valley" and send it to incoming Treasurer (pending May 10 vote) Mackenzie Roeder, 326 Stillwater Avenue #13, Old Town ME 04468.

Dues are payable by June 30, but National allows a three-month grace period. If you pay later than the final deadline of September 30, National will consider you a *new member!* To maintain your record accurately, please renew by September 30.
